Such forms will allow non-privileged Bangladeshi nationals to get maximum tax benefit. <p>Non privileged foreigners are not entitled to get Transfer of Residence Benefits. Bangladeshi (those who holding dual citizen ship) are entitles to get Transfer of Residence Benefits.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Customs duty and taxes imposed on all items. (Customs may impose nominal fine for subsequent baggage declaration)
