They must hold a valid passport showing their national I.D. number and a cancelled residence permit abroad. The following documents may be provided by the returning citizen as evidence of termination of residency abroad:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) copy of a residential Legalised lease contract or house ownership title in Jordan</li> <li>2) Children's registration forms in Jordanian schools</li> <li>3) Endorsed new work contract.</li> <li>4) Letter of termination of employment or the resignation abroad.</li> </ol> </li> <li>▪ The household effects have been owned and used abroad by the owner and for his continued personal use.</li> <li>▪ Effects are used more than 30% (extent of use is normally assessed by customs officers)</li> </ul>	<p><u>Duration of clearance procedures &amp; release of shipments:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Air freight shipments: 2 working days</li> <li>• Sea freight shipments: <b>7 - 9 working days</b> (provided all documents are in hand and in order )</li> </ul> <p>Exemption from duty does not apply to the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All new items and items used less than 30%.</li> <li>• Musical instruments.</li> <li>• Office equipment.</li> <li>• Satellite equipment.</li> <li>• Video cameras.</li> <li>• CD's.</li> <li>• Facsimile machines.</li> <li>• Amounts in excess of the permitted duty free allowance per family of 2 pieces of household electrical appliances.</li> </ul> <p>Returning Jordanians and Non Diplomat Foreign Individuals categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Importation of household effects should take place within 6 months of owner's date of entry and may arrive in several shipments. Owner or spouse should be physically present in Jordan at time of customs clearance.</li> <li>• All shipments are subject to full physical customs inspection. The presence of owner is advisable in order to answer any of the Inspector's questions. If any item is locked, keys should be available.</li> <li>• Video and audiocassettes, books, magazines, records &amp; CD's are subject to</li> </ul>

If specifications are not within the permitted criteria the telephone will be confiscated or owner has to re-export it at his own expense.</li> <li>• Satellite equipment requires the approval of Radio &amp; TV Corp. Therefore, the equipment's catalogue should be made available &amp; removed from the shipment for physical check. As this usually takes some time, a separate customs formality will have to be made at own owner's cost.</li> <li>• Items found unsuitable will be confiscated.</li> </ul>

<b>Diplomats' Removals &amp; motor vehicles</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Original OBL/AWB.</li> <li>• Franchise letter. This is obtained by Embassy on behalf of the Diplomat from the Ministry of Finance/Customs through the Ministry of External Affairs.</li> <li>• Import customs declaration form stamped and signed by the Embassy.</li> <li>• Inventory list.</li> </ul>	Duty free entry.	A diplomat must be in Jordan prior to his/her HHG arrival. They need to register with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs through their Embassy for in order to be granted the exemption status of custom duties and taxes on their HHG & Cars.

<b>Motor vehicles</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• OBL.</li> <li>• Ownership title.</li> <li>• Valid motorcar licence.</li> <li>• Import customs declaration form signed by owner.</li> </ul>	<p>Subject to duty and VAT taxes.</p>	<p>Importation of motor vehicles older than six years is allowed at present</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Passenger Cars operating on diesel are NOT ALLOWED</li> <li>▪ If the consignee is duty exempt (i.e. a diplomat) then the car would be tax exempt as well.</li> <li>▪ If the consignee is a taxed foreigner importing a car in his/her name, then the vehicle can be imported on a temporary entry basis for a period up to 6 months with a renewal every 3months. After the temporary period the car would have to leave the country or the owner would have to pay full customs duties.</li> <li>▪ If the consignee is a returning Jordanian then s/he would have to pay customs duties in all cases, unless the same car was exported earlier from Jordan (all customs duties paid), and is now being re-imported.</li> <li>▪ <u>Cars older than five years will not into Jordan unless they are under diplomatic status.</u></li> </ul>

Video Cameras</li> <li>2. Personal Office Equipment</li> <li>3. Satellite Receivers and their all accessories ( Dish, Signal receiver)</li> <li>4. Musical Appliances</li> <li>5.
