		The wood packing material must be marked in a visible location on each article, on at least two opposite sides of the article, with a legible and permanent mark. The mark can be painted with permanent black painting.	
		The colours red and orange do not have to be used as colour of the mark. Labels or adhesive are not allowed.	
		The approved format for the mark is as follows, where XX would be replaced by the country code, 000 by the producer number, YY by the treatment type (HT or MB) and AAA by the inspection agency logo.
