The Destination Agent must have all the original documents before the arrival of the shipment at the port.</li> </ul> <p>Time of the Dispatch: 5 or 6 days.</p> <p><b>Foreigners and Returning Citizens</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In order to qualify as a Bolivian citizen returning to the country, the person needs to show evidence that s/he has remained outside of the country for at least two years and did not enter Bolivia for more than 30 days.</li> <li>• To be granted the Customs taxes relief during the shipment clearance, the arrival of the household goods and personal effects, need to arrive one month before and up to four months after the arrival of the owner.</li> <li>• Customs proceeding for the verification of the shipment content requires the presence of the owner or the legal proxy.</li> <li>• Taxes relief is granted one time per family.</li> <li>• The vehicles are not considered as personal effects.</li> </ul>

<b>Prohibited Articles</b>			<b>Narcotics, drugs, explosives, pornographic material, firearms, ammunitions, precursors and refrigerators with gas R-12.</b>
<b>Wood Articles</b>			<b>By new dispositions of the SENASAG (organization for the control of plagues), the shipping that contain wood, like finished furniture, adornments, packing material, etc., must be fumigated in destination and to count on their respective Phytosanitary certificate of this organization.</b>

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<p><b>Manufactured Objects that Contaminate the Atmosphere</b></p>			<p>For the dispositions of IBNORCA (Institute of Quality Norms of Bolivia, entity for the pollution control), shipments that have manufactured objects that contaminate the atmosphere, like refrigerators, motors, oxygen tanks, vehicles, etc. must be made the inspection in destination, in order to obtain the certification of gases granted and not noxious to the atmosphere.</p>
<p><b>Fumigation of imported and exported wooden crates</b></p>		<p>The Bolivian Government adopted ISPM-15 (International standards for Phytosanitary Measures Publication 15) Guidelines for Regulating Wood Packaging Material in International Trade (aka NIFM-15) to standardise the treatment of wood packing materials used for the transport of goods.</p> <p>Shipments into or out of the country in wooden packaging, need to have a Seal, certifying that the shipment has received the required treatment (HT = Heated Treatment [a minimum wood core temperature of 56°C for a minimum of 30 minutes] or fumigation with Methyl Bromide (MT). The minimum temperature should not be less than 10°C and the minimum exposure time should not fall below 16 hours.</p> <p>The treatments established in the present regulation have the intent to reduce the introduction and/or the dissemination of quarantine plagues associated to the wood packing.</p>	<p>This regulation DOES NOT apply to wood packing materials manufactured of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Raw wood of 6 mm thickness or less</li> <li>• Processed wood produced by glue, heat and pressure, or a combination thereof</li> <li>• Plywood sheets &amp; agglomerated sawdust sheet</li> <li>• Oriented wooden fibre sheets</li> <li>• Sawdust &amp; Wooden fibre</li> </ul>

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		<p>The wood packing material must be marked in a visible location on each article, on at least two opposite sides of the article with a legible and permanent mark in black ink. Labels and adhesives are not allowed.
