Importation of wooden packages		Peru has adopted the International Regulations on Phytosanitary Policy (NIMF) N° 15 on wooden packing used in international trade, adopted by the FAO in 2002. This regulation describes the phytosanitary measures applicable in order to reduce the introduction and plague dissemination risk through wooden packings.	Compliance with this regulation is mandatory in Peru as of September 01, 2005.
		Phytosanitary inspection will be done at the port/airport of entry in Peru. If packings are not marked per NIMF N° 15, entry will be denied. If packings are properly labelled, but evidence of live plagues is found, Customs may deny entry, put packages in quarantine, order their treatment, return them to origin or destroy them.
